- Shortness of breath
- Chest or back pain
- Persistent cough
- Brown or red-flecked phlegm
- Black or tarry stools


An evaluation of asbestos-related disease should include:

- Taking of your history
 - Physical exam
 - Breathing test
 - CT Scan
 - Evaluation for colon cancer
